Where Jesus Finds Them is Different Than Where He Leads Them.

Three Steps in this Journey

Jesus Joins Them on a Journey of Hopelessness.

V.17 And he said to them, "What is this conversation that you are holding with each other as you walk?" And they stood still, looking sad.

Their Whole World Had Been Taken Over By Sadness and Defeat.

- They Had a High View of Their Circumstances. V.20-21
- They Had a Low View of the Savior. V.19

They see the circumstances with fullness, but they view Jesus with smallness.

To Whom Have You Trusted the Power to Shape Your Journey?

Jesus Joins Them on a Journey of Forgetfulness.

V.25-26 And he said to them, “O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?”

Is It Possible That the Loss of Your Own Hopes and Plans Have Eclipsed a Work of God that Hasn't Matched up with Your Expectations?

Jesus Joins Them on a Journey of Brokenness.

V.30-31 When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened, and they recognized him.

of Walking away from the
Promises of God in Dejection to
Rushing Back toward Them in
Victory.
