- It Met No Need for God.
- It Satisfied No Emptiness for God.
- It Fulfilled No Obligation God Owed.
- It Paid No Debt of God's.
- It Enriched God in No Way.
- It Improved No Condition for God.

Philippians 2:8

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.


Isaiah 53:5-6 10
